22	1. I reside in the City and County of Los Angeles, California.	
23	2. I heard that the City of Los Angeles ("The City") and the Los Angeles Police	
24	Department ("LAPD") were ordered to comply with the Assenza Judgment of Declaratory Relief	
25	and provide both a copy of a carry concealed weapon (CCW) license application and the LAPD	
26	Concealed Weapon License Policy to the public at all of its precincts and station houses. Below	
27	is a summary of my findings.	
28	3. On September 15, 2011, at app	proximately11:00 a.m., I went to the Harbor Division

Station in San Pedro to request information on applying for a CCW license. I obtained a copy of the CCW application and LAPD Concealed Weapon License Policy.

- 4. On September 15, 2011, at approximately 11:30 a.m., I went to the Southwest Station near Leimert Park. I spoke to an officer whose badge number is 14287. I asked for information on applying for a CCW license. The officer located both the CCW application and LAPD Concealed Weapon License Policy and provided them to me.
- 5. On September 15, 2011, at approximately 11: 45 a.m., I went to the Olympic Station near Koreatown to request information on applying for a CCW license. In speaking with Officer Viscanlo, he indicated that he did not have any CCW documents. He told me that I had to go downtown, to the LAPD headquarters, and ask for the CCW application there. He was unwilling to assist me beyond directing me downtown. I left the Olympic Station without a CCW application and LAPD Concealed Weapon License Policy.
- 6. On September 15, 2011, at approximately 12:00 p.m., I went to the Central Station in Downtown Los Angeles. I spoke to Officer Enriquez, and a second officer whose name I can not recall. When I inquired into receiving information on applying for a CCW license, Officer Enriquez informed me that Central Station did not have the application and I had to go to the administrative offices in a different building in order to obtain the application. Officer Enriquez gave me a card and wrote down the address and phone number of the office I should go to.

 Officer Enriquez also told me that there were new laws coming into effect and that weapons would no longer be permitted to be concealed. I left the Central Police Station without a CCW application and LAPD Concealed Weapon License Policy. Attached hereto is a true and accurate copy of the card I received from Officer Enriquez at Exhibit "A."
- 7. Neither the Olympic Police Station nor the Central Police Station provided me with a copy of the CCW application or the LAPD Concealed Weapon License Policy.

I declare under the penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct. If called to testify, I would testify to the above facts.
