Legal Community Against Violence (LCAV) has filed a motion
for amicus curiae status in this action, asking to file a brief,
in connection with the parties' dispositive motions, in support of
the constitutionality of California Penal Code sections 25850 and
26150, et seq. No opposition to the motion has been filed.

Having considered the papers submitted by LCAV, the Court
GRANTS its unopposed motion (Docket No. 57). In response to
Plaintiff Therese Marie Pizzo's motion for summary judgment, LCAV
may file a brief that addresses only Plaintiff's claims regarding
the constitutionality of California Penal Code sections 25850 and
26150, et seq. LCAV may appear at the hearing on the parties'
dispositive motions. It shall not participate in this litigation
in any manner not provided by this Order.

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1 Plaintiff filed her motion for summary judgment on June 14,
 2 2012. Defendants' oppositions and cross-motions for summary
 3 judgment are due on June 28, 2012. The Court is no longer
 4 available on July 26, 2012, the date on which the dispositive
 5 motion hearing was set previously. Accordingly, the Court
 6 modifies the remainder of the briefing and hearing schedule on the
 7 dispositive motions as follows:

8 9 Deadline for LCAV to file its 10 brief, not to exceed fifteen 11 pages, which shall not repeat any arguments raised by Defendants.	Thursday, July 5, 2012
12 Deadline for Plaintiff to file 13 her reply in support of her 14 motion for summary judgment, 15 opposition to Defendants' 16 motions for summary judgment and response to LCAV's arguments, contained in a single brief of fifty pages or less.	Thursday, July 12, 2012
17 Deadline for the National Rifle 18 Association (NRA) to file its 19 amicus brief of fifteen pages or 20 less, addressing San Francisco Police Code sections 4512, 1290 and 613.10(g) only and not repeating any arguments raised by Plaintiff.	Monday, July 16, 2012
21 Deadline for Defendant Attorney 22 General to file her reply in 23 support of her motion for summary judgment, contained in a brief of fifteen pages or less.	Thursday, July 19, 2012
24 Deadline for the San Francisco 25 Defendants to file their reply 26 in support of their motion for 27 summary judgment and response to the NRA's brief, contained in a single brief of thirty pages or less.	Monday, July 23, 2012

1 Hearing on the parties' motions
2 for summary judgment and further
case management conference.

Thursday, August 9, 2012, at
2:00 p.m.

3 The Court notes that the final pretrial conference and trial
4 dates may need to be continued. The Court will entertain a
5 stipulation or motion to change the schedule set forth above,
6 provided that the parties' briefs are filed in series as set forth
7 above and not simultaneously, and that briefing is completed at
8 least two weeks prior to the hearing date.
