20	More than a week has passed since this court ordered Defendant to produce the					
21	records previously filed under seal. This Court has also advised Plaintiff that he					
22	needs to amend the complaint, but having returned to California, Plaintiff has					
23	confirmed that the Defendant has not complied with the order to immediately produce					
24	the records filed under seal. In an effort to see if there was a problem with counsel,					
25	Plaintiff reviewed the county counsel website which states:					
26	The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department has two members of the Office of County Counsel assigned as Sheriff's legal counsel. Legal counsel advises the Office of the Sheriff and represents the Department in administrative and judicial proceedings.

Counsel meets weekly with the Board of Deputy Chiefs and the Office of the 1 Sheriff to discuss current law enforcement issues, policies, legislation, pending 2 litigation and other matters affecting the Department. Cynthia O'Neill advises on labor and employment matters, sits on the 3 Department's personnel records retention and legislative committees, and 4 represents the Department in arbitration, employment litigation, and before the 5 Civil Service Commission. Algeria Ford and Rick Van Frank from the Office of The County Counsel 6 assist in the employment law assignment by representing the Department in Civil Service Commission hearings and civil litigation. 7 Steve Singley advises on most non-employment related matters, including 8 issues concerning the detention and corrections bureau, the civil division, court 9 services, coroner division, the administration bureau, responds to various motions and subpoenas, reviews contracts and memoranda of understanding 10 with vendors and other agencies, replies to Public Record Act requests and 11 provides general legal advice to the Department 12 As such, Plaintiff contacted attorney Singley to see if there was a problem with 13 attorney Ford and to inquire as to why the county was still requiring forms in 14 violation of State Law and did not post its policies- Mr. Singley simply referred the 15 matter back to attorney Ford. Plaintiff cannot even begin to consider an amended 16 complaint without viewing the documents lodged with the court, and continues to 17 believe the best and most expeditious manner to handle this matter is an order simply 18 substituting the real party in interest, i.e. John McMahon as Defendant, but while 19 Defendant flaunts the orders of this Court and continues to deny that the Second 20 Amendment affords a Fundamental civil liberty, Plaintiffs hands are tied absent 21 Judicial intervention. 22 23 June 18, 2014 /s/24 25 Jonathan W.
