I, Lieutenant John Hennessey, declare as follows:

- I am presently employed as the Officer in Charge of the Homicide Detail for the San Francisco Police Department ("SFPD"). I have held this position for three years, and have been employed by the SFPD for a total of 32 years.
- 2. My office carefully tracks the homicides committed each year in San Francisco, including the manner in which the victims were killed. The following table identifies the number of homicide victims each year for the past five years, the number of those victims who were killed by firearms, and the percentage of the victims who were killed by firearms.

Year	Total Homicides	Firearm Homicides	Percentage of Homicides by Firearm
2001	64	39	61%
2002	, 68	40	59%
2003	70	49	70%
2004	88	63	72%
2005	96	80	83%

- 3. As this table indicates, the number of homicides in San Francisco has increased each year for the past five years.
- 4. The number of firearms homicides have increased dramatically as well, more than doubling during the past five years.
- 5. The most recent homicide came on Saturday, January 21, 2006. A man was shot and killed in the Bayview during a carjacking.
- 6. Firearms homicides have not only increased in real numbers; they have increased as a percentage of the overall homicides as well. As the above table shows, over the past three years
