I, Lieutenant Colleen Fatooh, declare as follows:

- I am presently employed as the Director of Youth Service the San Francisco 1. Police Department ("SFPD"). I have been coordinating Youth Service programs for the past six years, and have been employed by the SFPD for a total of 20 years.
- Approximately three years ago, in response to the increase in gun violence at or near San Francisco's schools, the Police Department and the San Francisco Unified School District ("SFUSD") adopted a "lockdown" policy to protect schoolchildren from firearms.
- To implement this policy, the Police Department orders a school "locked 3. down" whenever it determines that its students may be threatened by gun violence. We work with school employees to shut off all entrances and exits to the school and to ensure that nobody can leave or enter the building until the threat has been neutralized.
- Since the beginning of this school year which began in September 2005 we have been forced to lock down at least 10 schools due to the threat of gun violence.
- Most recently, just before Thanksgiving we were forced to lock down seven 5. schools in the Visitacion Valley area: Burbank Middle School, Hillcrest Elementary School, Visitacion Valley Elementary School, Burton High School, the San Francisco Elementary School, Saint Elizabeth's Elementary School and E.R. Taylor Elementary School. We locked down these schools after receiving reports of an armed homicide suspect running through McClaren Park nearby.
- During the previous week, we were forced to lock down Burnett Child 6. Development Center in Bayview after a gunman was seen across the street. Because the Burnett Center hosts an after school program for children from numerous other schools, we were forced to divert approximately 25 buses full of children that were on their way to the Center before it was locked down. The parents of these children had to be contacted and informed that they needed to pick up their children.
- 7. More recently, we have had several gun-related incidents at or near the schools. For example, on Wednesday, January 18, 2006, officers exchanged fire with two

students on the campus of Luther Burbank Middle School. The school was not locked down because the students were apprehended. On Friday, January 20, 2006, a student was shot and injured in Potrero Hill. And about three weeks ago, a child was reported to have brandished a handgun on the Burton High School campus. Although he was not apprehended, officers caught another student with a handgun while investigating the initial report.

8. In my experience, since we began locking down schools about three years ago, almost all of the lockdowns have taken place in San Francisco's southern neighborhoods, specifically Bayview/Hunter's Point, the Mission District, Visitacion Valley, Ingleside and Potrero Hill.
