


NARRATIVE

While working the Night Detective Unit at Lennox Station, I was contacted by Deputies Ruben Ledesma and John Silverstein. They had called me from the arrest scene and requested instructions regarding two assault rifles they had recovered in a protective sweep of the suspect's residence, while on a "man with a gun" call. Neither weapon was registered in AFS.

In reviewing the requirements of 12280(b) PC, the suspect was in violation for possessing a "Thompson" carbine rifle, which by definition under 12276.1 PC was outlawed because of the pistol grip, the detachable magazines and the flash suppressor. This is clearly depicted in the photograph below, wherein Deputy Ledesma is holding the "Thompson."



The suspect was also in violation of possessing an AK-47, which is specifically listed in the ban under 12276 PC, and not just by the definition of 12276.1 PC



The suspect told the deputies that he had purchased the AK-47 fifteen years ago and the "Thompson" seven years ago. The provisions of 12280(b) PC state that if the suspect can provide proof that the assault weapon was legally possessed prior to June 1st of 1989, that the first violation of the section could be reduced. If the suspect were able to provide receipts for the times he claimed he purchased the weapons, he "might" be able to receive a reduction with respect to the AK-47. However, the "Thompson," by the suspect's own admission, was allegedly purchased after June 1st, 1989. Therefore, a reduction pursuant to the code is not provided for.

Regardless of the suspect's claims about actions of the neighborhood kids that brought the response of deputy personnel, I informed the deputies and their sergeant that a felony arrest was in fact justified and required of them in that they had reason to believe a felony had taken place. The deputies took the suspect into custody.

With respect to the suspect, I have known him through field contacts I have had with

him over the last ten years. The suspect has had an on-going dispute with his neighbors ever since I have known him, and he has made numerous complaints about the other people in his neighborhood. These complaints have ranged from unsubstantiated drug dealers, weapons violations, noise, rocks being thrown at his house, gang members, loud music to baseballs landing in his yard "on purpose."

Not withstanding any validity or lack of validity to the previous complaints made by the suspect in this case, this Investigator is <u>extremely</u> concerned to learn that the suspect was armed with two assault rifles. The suspect's previously demonstrated anger towards his neighbors, coupled by his weapons armament, pose a serious risk to the safety of the community.

Based on the above, it is my strongest recommendation to the Inglewood District Attorney's Office that this case be issued a felony complaint alleging a violation of 12280(b) PC.


On 08-03-2001, the Honorable Judge Rodney Forneret of the Inglewood Superior Court (Division 5) signed a Search Warrant for additional weapons and ammunition at the suspect's home.


On 08-09-2001 at 1900 hours, I was accompanied by Sergeant Claudine Sanchez, Deputy Ruben Ledesma, Deputy John Silverstein, Deputy Steve Longan, and Deputy Joe Garrido in going to 1441 W 103rd St (suspect's residence) to serve the warrant. Upon arrival, Sgt. Sanchez telephoned the suspect and advised him that we had a Search Warrant for his house. He was instructed to exit, and he complied. Additionally, the suspect's mother exited the house.

Although the house was allegedly now empty (although we couldn't be sure because several neighbors have reported that the suspect sometimes has a male friend at the location), knock and notice was conducted in accordance with PC 844.


Entry was made without incident and the location was searched.

The northwest bedroom was searched by Deputies Ledesma and Silverstein. In the closet, they located a Mosin-Nagant M44 rifle (with attached bayonet). They also located two (2) loaded cal .223 magazines in the same closet. Additionally, Deputy Ledesma found a loaded cal .45 drum for the previously seized "Tommy Gun" under the couch in the living room.






Inside the garage, Deputy Garrido and I located two pistols, that were each separately wrapped in black plastic adjacent to the northwest wall behind a red vehicle, near the trunk. Both the Browning cal .380 pistol and the Kimel Industries 9mm pistol (Tec-9 copy) had accompanying loaded magazines.





Both of the above pistols were registered to the suspect in AFS, however it remains unknown in the Kimel 9mm (above left) had further been registered as an "Assault Weapon." We were prohibited from asking the suspect questions about this pistol because I had previously received notice from the suspect's attorney that the suspect was not to speak to us without representation in this case.

It should be noted that the Browning cal .380 (above right) is of the same description as given in the initial call of 07-14-2001. This gave credence to the observations made by the witnessing children of the same day. Furthermore, I found it suspicious that the only weapons that could have been the one of the ones seen on 07-14-2001 were now wrapped in plastic in the garage, as if they were being hidden or readied for disposal with use of the aforementioned vehicle. All of the suspect's other weapons and accompanying ammunition were located in the house, and were not wrapped up in bags.



Inside the livingroom behind the hall door, Deputy Garrido located a loaded Winchester 12 gauge shotgun. This shotgun additionally had a sling with a bandoleer of ammunition.

The previously mentioned M44 rifle and the shotgun (depicted on the left) had no record in AFS, although there is currently no legal requirement for these particular type weapons to be registered.

All of the above seized weapons and ammunition were ultimately turned over to me and I later booked them into evidence at Lennox Station (book 170, page 142 & 143).

It should be noted that while surveying the location, I saw numerous boxes of assorted ammunition in the closet of the northwest bedroom. I also saw a display board on the wall of the same bedroom. This display board included nunchakus, a blow gun (for darts), a metal replica hand grenade (inert), gas masks, knives, and other military type items.

I did not seize the items on the display board, although some of the items were clearly a violation of PC 12020(a). Because the items were affixed to a display board, it did not appear likely that they were for ready usage. Additionally, I did not seize the additional ammunition, because we had already recovered ammunition in the loaded magazines, and it appeared that all weaponry that could use the ammunition that was left had already been seized. However, I am prepared to testify to my observations regarding the PC 12020(a) violations and to seek an additional Search Warrant, if requested by the District Attorney's Office.

The suspect was issued a receipt for the property that was seized pursuant to the Search Warrant. The receipt has one error, in that it states that the Browning pistol is a 9mm. It should read that the pistol is a cal .380.

Lastly, it should be noted that numerous citizens in the neighborhood approached us prior to leaving. The were expressing sincere gratitude to us for removing the weapons from the suspect's residence. We were told that the suspect had an extensive history of aggression towards neighbors, and they had seen the suspect with weapons in the past. Several neighbors told us they were willing to be contacted in the future for anything regarding the suspect's activities.

NARRATIVE

The purpose of this report is to provide additional active information regarding the incident that led to the protective sweep and the recovery of the assault weapons. I was contacted today by Detective Renfrow regarding this case. He had some questions as to the purpose of the protective sweep, in lieu of securing the location and seeking a search warrant. I told him the following:

Upon arriving on scene on 07-14-2001, we contacted the informants who told us that the suspect had been pointing a silver handgun at the local children. Additionally, I saw the suspect standing in his front yard with what I believed was a rifle. After the suspect looked in our direction, he ran inside his residence holding what I believed was a rifle. The suspect is well known by the deputies assigned at Lennox Station as having a continuous hostile relationship with the African Americans in the neighborhood, and I had been previously briefed about the suspect and his situation by Detective Renfrow several years ago, when he (Detective Renfrow) was my field Training Officer.

Based on my previously learned information about the suspect, coupled by my direct observations, I believed that the suspect's problems with his neighbors had culminated today in an armed confrontation. I was concerned enough to request assistance from other responding units, which meant that these units were to come to the location with lights and sirens (code-3). This was documented by Detective Renfrow when he made a copy of the radio traffic on cassette tape.

As the units were responding, the suspect exited his house where he was detained. As he did so, I saw the suspect's mother standing in the doorway of the residence. In addition to the suspect, Detective Renfrow and other deputies at Lennox Station had previously informed me that the suspect's mother also had a history of problems with the neighbors. In fact, I have personally handled calls involving the Rosenberger residence since my assignment at Lennox Station.

Because I saw the suspect take what I believed to be a rifle inside the house, the fact that the information we had received on scene was that the suspect had been pointing a handgun, the fact that there is a history of the suspect and his mother having problems with persons in the neighborhood, the fact that the mother was inside the

residence when the suspect came outside, the fact that it appeared the problems had escalated into an armed confrontation, and the fact that I did not know who else the suspect might have enlisted to assist him in his confrontation with the neighborhood, I believed there was a risk to community and officer safety inside the suspect's residence.

I believed that there was the rifle I saw the suspect carrying inside the residence, the handgun reported by the informants inside the suspect's residence, and I knew the suspect's mother was inside the residence. Because of the obvious escalation that had occurred, I believed the suspect might have had somebody else inside the residence that was present to assist him in what was apparently now an "armed war" against the neighborhood.

Based on all of the above, I believed there was sufficient cause to make a protective sweep of the residence to ensure there was nobody else inside that could be hiding or that could use the weapons observed to harm deputy personnel or members of the neighboring community. During the protective sweep, the two assault rifles were recovered.

The fact that this was a "protective sweep" and not a search, was documented by the evidence that was recovered itself. Although the first report by Silverstein indicated that two cal. 223 magazines were recovered with the AK-47, this was in error. My examination of the magazines indicated that one was a cal .223, but the other one was a 7.62mm (cal .30). In fact, I tried the magazines, and only the cal .223 fit the AK-47. Had this been a "search" and not a "protective sweep," we would have searched for the weapon that went with the second magazine. Additionally, the handgun reportedly seen in possession of the suspect was not searched for. As of the writing of this report, it is my current belief that the suspect has additional evidence and weaponry inside his residence.

As for the claims that the "silver handgun" seen in possession of the suspect was in reality a digital camera, and that the rifle I saw him holding was a black stick on the porch, these were self-serving statements made by the suspect himself. They became evidence in this case based on our impartial approach to the investigation, and the possibility that they could be used as evidence in his defense.

Attached with this report are copied of the MDT logs for the last year, where units were dispatched to the Rosenberger house at their. This does not include calls made to the Lennox C.O.P.'s team, or the times the suspect and/or his mother have come to Lennox station in person.

NARRATIVE

I told Rodriguez that the weapon did show as being registered to Rosenberger in AFS, but it did not show as an "assault weapon." After checking the records via serial number, Rodriguez corrected me.

Rodriguez informed me that AFS had a "dealer's report of sale" (DROS) to Rosenberger for the Kimel, however, it WAS NOT registered as an assault weapon with the Department of Justice. Rodriguez told me this weapon was required to be registered based on its characteristics by 01-01-2001, pursuant to Senate Bill 23.

I read the serial number of the Norinco rifle to Rodriguez, giving him "84S403675." Rodriguez explained that the correct serial number was 403675. The preceding "84S" actually stood for the model. This particular weapon is in fact listed under 12276 PC by make and model, and Rodriguez said it was on an earlier banned list. This weapon (AK series or AK-47 copycat) was required to be registered as an assault weapon with the Department of Justice by 03-31-1992 as a category 1 weapon. Rodriguez checked and found that this weapon was not registered either. Additionally, all listed banned weapons not in the category list were required to be registered by 01-23-2001.

Lastly, Rodriguez checked the serial number of the Tommy Gun and found that it was not registered as an assault weapon with the Department of Justice. By characteristic, this weapon fell under 12276.1 PC and was required to be registered as an assault weapon by 01-01-2001, pursuant to Senate Bill 23.

I informed Rodriguez I would need a certified document attesting to the fact that none of the above three mentioned assault weapons were registered as assault weapons, yet they were required to be, in the event this case goes to trial. Rodriguez supplied me with the information to obtain such documentation and a letter of request was mailed.

This weapon (AK series or AK-47 copycat) was required to be registered as an assault weapon with the Department of Justice by 03-31-1992 as a category 1 weapon. Rodriguez checked and found that this weapon was not registered either. Additionally, all listed banned weapons not in the category list were required to be registered by 01-23-2001.

Lastly, Rodriguez checked the serial number of the Tommy Gun and found that it was not registered as an assault weapon with the Department of Justice. By characteristic, this weapon fell under 12276.1 PC and was required to be registered as an assault weapon by 01-01-2001, pursuant to Senate Bill 23.

I informed Rodriguez I would need a certified document attesting to the fact that none of the above three mentioned assault weapons were registered as assault weapons, yet they were required to be, in the event this case goes to trial. Rodriguez supplied me with the information to obtain such documentation and a letter of request was mailed.


Later variations

Several changes were made to the Thompson SMG between the two world wars. The original M1921, subsequently called M1921A when supplied in standard form, was sold unaltered for some years and the first 3,000 sales were of this type.

Model 1923 Military Thompson

In a further attempt to attract military sales, five M1921 guns were modified to fire the slightly longer .45in Remington round. Apart from rechambering for the new round, this version had a longer barrel with a fitting near the muzzle which could either take a folding bipod or a bayonet. The butt was bulked up, and a grooved front grip replaced the front hand grip. The idea was to turn the weapon into a squad light machine gun. It was demonstrated to a few military authorities and tested by the US Army in 1924, but no orders were forthcoming. Two further guns were modified with the same longer (16in/41cm) barrel and rechambering, but this time without the bipod fitting or the horizontal grooved handgrip—the pistol grip was retained. There was possibly the idea of police sales for this more powerful version, but none were made.

The Model 1923 Military Thompson was also offered with sling swivels for a




sling to meet military requirements. Subsequently this was an option on all models, the suffix S being applied to models so fitted.

Model 1921AC

Col Richard Cutts purchased his own M1921 Thompson and found one weakness of the gun in the hands of an inexperienced firer. With the first shot the muzzle jumped on recoil, and in full automatic it jumped again in rapid succession after every round, faster than the gunner could counter by forcing the muzzle down again. This meant that the gun tended to fire with a rising pattern. Cutts' first attempt to cure this was to fit a counterweight on the muzzle, but this had little effect. A physicist friend studied the problem and suggested an expansion chamber and tube at the muzzle to reduce the recoil by dispersing some of the propellant gases. The slotted unit was simply pushed onto the muzzle in front of the foresight and held in place by a tightened screw. The device was known as the Cutts Compensator and was sold from 1926 as an optional extra, adding \$25 to the price. Cutts got a royalty on sales, and the Lyman Gun Sight Corp made it. Many were retrofitted to existing guns. Over the years the Cutts Compensator was itself modified slightly, with the final types fitted on World War 2 guns. There were actually five variants with dimensional differences. The suffix C was subsequently added to all when the model numbers Cutts Compensator was fitted.

Model 1927 Thompson Semi-automatic Carbine

This was also called the Thompson Automatic Carbine Model 27A in Auto-Ordnance catalogues of the time. It was a Model 1921 gun modified to remove the automatic fire selector function so that the gun could only fire in semi-automatic mode (ie, single shots)—hence it was no longer a submachine gun. It was available with or without the Cutts Compensator or sling swivels, and another options was the grooved horizontal foregrip in place of the



vertical foregrip, this fitting being seemingly derived from the Model 1923. Guns with this feature were described as 'Special Grade' with an S suffix in place of the A—thus Model 27S. A further option offered was the 50-round drum magazine and the suffix D was added to the designation when this was supplied fitted. So it was possible to have a Model 27SCDS indicating: S—a Model 1927 carbine special grade (with horizontal foregrip), C—fitted with Cutts Compensator, D—50-round drum magazine and S—sling swivels.

The 27S was priced more highly than the 27A. On the Model 1927 the original Model 1921 and Thompson Submachine Gun lettering had been ground off the frame and model of 1927) and 'Thompson Semi-automatic Carbine' lettering stamped in its place. This weapon was offered to police forces and prison authorities who did not require the automatic fire facility. Some of these weapons were retrospectively converted back to fully automatic fire function—either officially or otherwise.

Model 1926 BSA Thompson

The Belgian Army had showed great interest in the Thompson SMG on General Thompson's original European tour and carried out field trials in 1923. The Belgians wanted to standardise ammunition on the 9mm Parabellum round, however, and wanted a rifle-style stock and sling. Leading British gun firm BSA (Birmingham Small Arms) had been given the licence for European Thompson sales and Auto-Ordnance asked BSA to remodel

the gun for the Belgian requirement. While the frame, box magazine and firing mechanism were all unchanged, the resulting weapon had a plain finless barrel and riflestyle butt and furniture. This was tested by both the French and Belgian armies but in the event no orders were forthcoming, even though the Belgians had mentioned a requirement for 10,000.

Additionally, the French army did not consider the BSA Thompson superior to any available French weapon of similar type.

Model 1929 BSA Thompson


BSA persisted in an attempt to produce a version of the Thompson SMG for the European market. The Model 1929 more closely resembled the American-made models, having the finned barrel, frame, horizontal foregrip, box magazine and firing mechanism identical. However, the butt was of more 'British' shape and there was a conventional rifle-type trigger and trigger guard with a small handgrip behind it, said to improve steadiness when firing from the hip. Versions were produced chambered to take the .45in ACP round.


ABOVE: BSA Thompson of 1929, .45in calibre version.



Thompson Submachine Gun NFA



Auto Ordnance manufactured fully automatic reproductions of the Thompson Submachine Gun from approximately 1975 and the Firearm Owners Protection Act (Public Law 99-308, effective May 19, 1986) prohibited the transfer to private of trens of any machine guns that were not lawfully registered in the effective date of the 1986 Act. Some fully automatic Coaliber Thompsons were manufactured, but their serial numbers are different from the .45 caliber guns described and are unavailable at this time.

With the exception of the .22 caliber guns earlier noted, all well Hurley Thompsons were caliber .45 automatic, canufactured in Model 1928 and M1 versions; however, the Lit designation "is actually incorrect, as the guns are in the LitA1 Thompson configuration" (see "The West Hurley M1 Bompson SMG," by Frank lannamico, Machine Gun News, and 1995, pages 40-42). All of the so-called "West Hurley" compsons have the letter "A" suffix in the serial number and West Hurley, New York, address stamped on the right do of the receiver. The Model 1928 has a 10.5" finned barrel and Cutts compensator (which adds about 2" to the barrel angli); the M1 has a 10.5" plain barrel and no compensator.

the quality of the West Hurley Thompsons has been and entinues to be actively debated. Some early guns were not self-manufactured and required considerable work, while sens of later manufacture were of superior manufacture and speritly fitted, with some of varying quality in between. Auto refinance assembled many early guns with GI parts, and sany collectors and shooters have replaced key parts with GI arts, in some cases to improve shooting performance. Each

gun must be evaluated individually by a qualified professional gunsmith and test fired to assess its quality of manufacture and/or mechanical/shooting proficiency, and the advisability of switching out factory parts for GI parts.

The original wholesale price of each model was \$525 (\$750 retail), and these values have risen dramatically along with the prices of many other machine guns, as demand has begun to catch up with the limited supply of "transferables" that was "frozen" by the 1986 Act. The M1 was manufactured only during 1985-86, and relatively few were made compared with the Model 1928, although the Model 1928 has so far been consistently valued higher. West Hurley Thompsons were originally considered "shooters" rather than collector's items, but the M1 (the so-called "Private Ryan" gun, after the movie), was recently ruled to be a "curio or relic" by ATF, and it seems reasonable to assume that the Model 1928 will eventually follow. The prices listed here are approximate, and reflect the premium that many people are willing to pay to own even a reproduction Thompson.

Total Model 1928 production was 3,306 guns, including Commemorative engraved Thompsons with various serial numbers, whose current retail prices may range from about \$7,500 to \$10,000 or more. (In 1992 there was a special run of 141 guns made for export or law enforcement only). The number of Commemorative guns manufactured are: World War II, 85 guns; Korean War, 145 guns; and Vietnam War, 17 guns. Total M1 production was 609 guns. There were also various special serial numbers included in the M1 production that are not listed; the factory would honor any request for a "special serial number," and these were not in the normal serial number ranges.



The Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (Public Law 103-322, effective September 13, 1994) has banned the production of certain so-called "assault weapons" and high-capacity ammunition feeding devices until 2004. Although those manufactured before September 13, 1994. can be and are imported regularly, some members of Congress have repeatedly introduced legislation that would prohibit their importation. As magazines wear out and replacements are sought, the prices and availability of highcapacity magazines continue to rise and vary dramatically. Standard GI Thompson 20- or 30-round stick magazines that once were plentiful and sold for \$5 to \$6, have increased to \$20 or more. Original Thompson drums have always been relatively costly, and prices of even West Hurley drums of modern manufacture suggest a high demand. New-in-box 50-round West Hurley L drums that last year were priced from \$350 to \$700 have risen to minimum asking prices of \$650, but not much higher; and 100-round C drums that last year were offered from \$750 to \$1,000, have risen to \$1,000 and higher. The quality of the West Hurley drums, particularly the 100-round C drums have been vastly criticized, and buyers would be well advised to request a demonstration before closing a purchase. As is the case with West Hurley Thompsons, some drums run flawlessly, others need work, and still others apparently are virtually unusable. The prices for vintage Thompson L drums range from \$650 and up, while the much-sought-after C drum commands \$3,000 or more. The uneven demand for these drum magazines precludes establishing firm retail prices at this time.
