DECLARATION OF JACK LESLIE RAINEY

I Jack Leslie Rainey declare as follows:

1. I am a resident of Peoria, Arizona.
2. I am employed as the Manager of System Design and Construction at an electric utility company.
3. I have been a member of Safari Club International for over nineteen years.
4. I have been a hunter for over 49 years.
5. I was introduced to hunting by my father who would take me dove hunting.


- 1 6. In addition to my extensive hunting in Arizona, I have hunted elk in Colorado;
2 white tail deer in Kansas; and grizzly and black bear, dall sheep, caribou,
3 mountain goat and sitka black tail deer in Alaska.
- 4 7. I have also hunted outside the United States. In Zimbabwe, I hunted kudu,
5 bushbuck, impala, wildebeest, and warthog. In South Africa, I hunted kudu,
6 gemsbuck, nyala, and impala.
- 7 8. I have hunted just about everywhere in Arizona.
- 8 9. In Arizona, I have elk, mule deer, whitetail deer, antelope, javelina, turkey, and
9 mountain lion.
- 10 10. In the Kaibab National Forest, I hunted for mule deer.
- 11 11. When hunting in the Kaibab in the past, I used both lead-based and non-lead
12 based ammunition.
- 13 12. I choose lead-based ammunition because it is more accurate, available and
14 performs better on impact for a quicker and cleaner take of the animal.
- 15 13. When I used non-lead based ammunition in the past, I either purchased it or
16 received it from the State of Arizona.
- 17 14. When shooting big game, I choose not to use non-lead based ammunition
18 because the accuracy of the non-lead does not come close to the accuracy of
19 the lead-based ammunition.
- 20 21 15. In 2012, I received a deer tag for the late hunt for the east side of the Kaibab
22 National Forest and hunted that area. I also received a tag for 2015, as did two
23 of my sons, and we hunted deer in the Kaibab National Forest. I have applied
24 for a tag for 2016 and have definite plans to hunt in the Kaibab National Forest
25 later in 2016 if I receive a tag.
- 26 27 16. If this litigation results in a ban on the use of lead ammunition for hunting in
28 the Kaibab National Forest, I will lose the opportunity to hunt in the way that is
most efficient and effective and that results in an immediate and painless take

1 of the animal. If I am required to use non-lead based ammunition, it will
2 reduce the likelihood of my success and will force me to shorten the range at
3 which I am comfortable to shoot.

4 17. I make this statement in support of Safari Club International's motion to
5 intervene in this lawsuit.

6 In accordance with 28 U.S.C. §1746, I declare under penalty of perjury that the
7 foregoing is true and correct.
