#### **DECLARATION OF RICHARD TOMPKINS**

I, RICHARD TOMPKINS, declare as follows:

- I am a Detective III with the Los Angeles Police Department ("LAPD"), currently assigned as the Officer in Charge ("OIC"), Gun Unit, Gang and Narcotics Division. I have over 20 years of service with the LAPD, the last eight of which have been with the Gun Unit. In my capacity as OIC of the Gun Unit, I supervise all Gun Unit activities, which includes all investigative functions associated with firearms and firearm trafficking in the City of Los Angeles. Prior to that I worked as a gang detective for five years, where I dealt with firearms issues on a regular basis.
- 2. As the OIC of the Gun Unit, I have completed staff projects related to firearm issues and developed strategies to combat gun trafficking. I interface with the United States Marshalls, Federal Bureau of Investigations, and the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms ("ATF"). In addition, I complete projects for LAPD which may include conducting analysis of proposed legislation and coordinating with other agencies to develop appropriate legislation on firearm legislation. I have testified while representing LAPD in Sacramento when working with lawmakers and analysts in order to answer questions on behalf of LAPD and ensure appropriate legislation for LAPD is proposed.
- 3. Additional Gun Unit responsibilities include receiving firearms shipped to LAPD from outside agencies, inspecting all licensed firearm dealer locations in the City to ensure compliance with federal, state, and local licensing requirements, seek prosecution of individuals violating firearm laws, firearm tracing for LAPD, maintain communication with Area detectives on gun matters and investigate and seek criminal filings on gun traffickers. The Gun Unit is also responsible for regulating firearms and ammunition purchases by convicted felons and those prohibited from owning firearms such as individuals under orders of a criminal protective order, civil restraining order, or orders from the court while as a condition of bail. The Gun Unit conducts gun trafficking investigations with ATF on firearm sales between local gang members and greater organized crime circuits. We train district attorneys and attorneys from the California Attorney General's office regarding firearm-related prosecutions. The Gun Unit participates in the APPS (Armed Prohibited Persons System) task force with the California Department of Justice for prohibited persons that are not authorized to carry, own, or possess firearms or ammunition. We provide expertise on guns in court cases, and assist the 21 LAPD divisions by providing

expertise or handling the entire case as appropriate. The Gun Unit also maintains special files on machine gun permits, destructive device permits, and federal aviation administration regulations, requirements, and procedures regarding the carrying of firearms on commercial aircraft flights.

- 4. I have personal knowledge of all the facts set forth herein and if called upon to testify, I could and would do so competently. As to those matters of which I am informed and believe, I believe them to be true and accurate.
- 5. The City of Los Angeles will be conducting an Anonymous Gun Buyback Program ("Program") on May 12, 2012 at six (6) locations across the City of Los Angeles. This is the fourth year in a row that the City has conducted the Program, which always takes place on the Saturday before Mother's Day. The Gun Buyback Program is conducted pursuant to Penal Code Section 27850. I am informed and believe that gun buyback programs occur in various cities and counties throughout the United States.
- 6. The public is made aware of the locations where the Program is being held through various forms of media, including flyers and radio and television ads, in English and Spanish. A true and correct copy of the flyer for this year's Program is attached hereto as Exhibit 1. As clearly stated on the flyer and in the ads, those who wish to participate in the Program ("Participants") are instructed to transport their firearm(s) unloaded in the trunk of their vehicle to any of the six locations. Program site operations are conducted by LAPD and staff from the Mayor's Office, including representatives of Gang Reduction and Youth Development. Authorized media and public officials are also allowed to be present.
- 7. Upon arriving at a Program location, the Participant and any other occupants of the Participant's vehicle are told to remain inside the vehicle while an LAPD officer retrieves the firearm(s) from the trunk and secures them. In exchange for the voluntary surrender of the firearm(s), the driver will be issued one or more gift cards (Ralph's supermarket or Visa). Participation in the Program is strictly anonymous.
- 8. Due to the presence of firearms, security and public safety at Program locations are of paramount importance. The Program occurs in parking lots of private and/or City-owned properties. At all locations, the portion of the parking lot designated for the Program is clearly marked by use of yellow tape, cones, police vehicles, and uniformed police officers. The only members of the public who

are allowed into the secured area are those participating in the Program by bringing firearms they are willing to voluntarily surrender. The City has agreed to indemnify each of the five non-City property owners involved in this year's Program and hold them harmless from liability that could arise due to use of their property. (True and correct copies of correspondence memorializing these agreements are attached hereto as Exhibits 2 through 6.) This potential liability is another reason LAPD wants to ensure that no personal injuries or property damage occur at Program events.

- 9. The only way LAPD can ensure the safety of the event for the participants in the Program, personnel staffing the Program, and the surrounding community is by minimizing the number of people in the secured area and ensuring they are authorized to be there. Other safety-related protocols must be followed to ensure public safety. The Bomb Squad is notified of the locations and is on standby to respond in case destructive devices (explosives) are discovered during the recovery of firearms. Destructive devices have been brought to Program locations in the past and have had to be rendered safe. Also, because the event is so highly-publicized, the public is aware that there will be hundreds of firearms and ammunition at program locations, which may attract a criminal element. The object of the Program is to allow people to get rid of unwanted guns to prevent future crimes. LAPD wants to avoid tragic outcomes at Program locations due to lack of security and adequate safety measures.
- 10. In the past, LAPD has monitored and patrolled the vehicles waiting in line to ensure that all firearms remain locked and secured in the trunks until they are safely and lawfully removed by an officer within the secured Program area. This practice will be continued during this year's Program to ensure public safety.
- 11. Members of the public are allowed to express themselves freely on the sidewalk immediately adjacent to Program locations, provided they are in compliance with all applicable state and local laws. People can verbally express themselves, display signs, and hand out written literature, as long as they do not impede traffic or otherwise violate the law. For instance, I was present at a Program event which took place in Mission Division in May 2011. During that event, I met with several members of the public who appeared, based on their literature and/or clothing, to be connected with Sons of Liberty and Fort Courage gun store. These individuals, who were present throughout the event, handed out literature and spoke with people who were waiting to enter the Program location. I introduced myself and explained the Program procedures. I told them they could talk to Participants and

hand out cards, but could not enter the secured area. I also advised these individuals that, for safety reasons, people could not open their trunks and display firearms in public and, even if they were licensed gun dealers, they were not allowed to conduct transactions in public.

12. I spoke with Mr. Bruce Boyer telephonically on May 3, 2012 after receiving a message to call him. During that conversation, we discussed various topics, including Gun Buyback policies and procedures. I explained the Program's mission and objectives to Mr. Boyer, and told him that if he were to enter the secured area at any Program location, he could be arrested. I advised him it is LAPD's job to safeguard the lives and property of the public during the administration of Program and we take that responsibility very seriously. The Program areas are cordoned off for the safety of the public and if unauthorized individuals enter these areas, they are subject to arrest.

I swear under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing is true and correct.




