APPELLANT'S UNOPPOSED MOTION TO EXTEND TIME FOR FILING REPLY BRIEF

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 26(b) and Ninth Circuit Rule 21-2.2(b), Appellant Kamala D. Harris, as California Attorney General, respectfully moves for a 21-day extension of time, to and including June 30, 2015, in which to file the reply brief. Counsel for Appellees consent to this extension of time.

By Order entered on December 2, 2014, Appellant's reply brief is due within 14 days after service of the answering brief. Declaration of Peter H. Chang (Chang Decl.) ¶ 3. Appellees filed their answer brief on May 26, 2015. *Id.* Appellant's reply brief is thus due on June 9, 2015. *Id.*

Appellant had previously made a single streamlined request to extend time to file its opening brief. Chang Decl. \P 4. Appellant has filed no other requests to extend time, either for its opening brief or for its reply brief. *Id.* \P 5.

Appellant seeks this extension of time because Appellant's lead counsel, Jonathan Eisenberg, is currently affected by a health issue that precludes him from preparing the reply brief within the current deadline. Declaration of Jonathan M. Eisenberg (Eisenberg Decl.) ¶ 4. On June 1, 2015, the undersigned counsel was asked to prepare the reply brief in Mr. Eisenberg's place. Chang Decl. ¶ 6. While the undersigned counsel is also counsel of record, Mr. Eisenberg is the lead counsel and was responsible for drafting the opening brief. Eisenberg Decl. ¶ 3. Before Mr. Eisenberg's medical complication arose, he was also expected to prepare the reply brief. *Id.* ¶ 4. The undersigned counsel thus requests the

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additional time so that he may have sufficient time to analyze the appellate issues and prepare the reply brief.

Appellant requests a 21-day extension because the undersigned counsel has, within the next three weeks, two hearings, a status conference, and a deposition, all of which require out-of-town travel. Chang Decl. ¶ 8. A 21-day extension, to and including June 30, would provide the undersigned counsel sufficient time to prepare the reply brief. With the extension, the brief will be filed within the time requested. Chang Decl. ¶ 9.

Counsel for Appellant have at all times exercised diligence; however, they could not have foreseen the medical complication that arose during the reply briefing period.

Counsel for Appellees consent to this motion for extension of time. Eisenberg Decl. ¶ 5.

DECLARATION OF JONATHAN M. EISENBERG IN SUPPORT OF APPELLANT'S MOTION TO EXTEND TIME FOR FILING REPLY BRIEF

- I, Jonathan M. Eisenberg, declare under penalty of perjury as follows:
- I am over 18 years of age. I make this declaration of my personal knowledge.
- 2. I am a deputy attorney general with the California Attorney General's Office. I am counsel of record for Appellant (Kamala D. Harris, as Attorney General of the State of California) and the lead attorney for Appellant in the above-entitled action, *Silvester v. Harris*. I have been counsel of record and lead attorney for Appellant since the action was first filed in the trial court and the original complaint served on Appellant.
- 3. I was the lead attorney in preparing the opening brief in the pending appeal in this matter.
- 4. I was to be the lead attorney in preparing Appellant's reply brief herein, which brief is currently due on June 9, 2015. However, I am currently affected by a serious medical issue whose negative effects heightened over the weekend of May 30-31, 2015, and I determined that I am not able to effectively and timely prepare Appellant's reply brief.
- 5. On June 1, 2015, by a telephone call, I informed Donald F. Kilmer, counsel of record for Appellees herein, of my medical situation, and the need for a brief extension of the deadline for Appellant's reply brief to be filed, so that another attorney, Peter H. Chang, who is also a deputy attorney general with the California Attorney General's Office, and who also has been counsel of record for Appellant in this case at both the trial and appellate levels, may take over for me as lead attorney on Appellant's reply brief.
