DECLARATION OF MICHELLE FLANAGAN

- 1. I, Michelle Flanagan, am a plaintiff in the above-entitled action. I make this declaration of my own personal knowledge and, if called as a witness, I could and would testify competently to the truth of the matters set forth herein.
 - 2. I am over the age of 21 and a current resident of Los Angeles County, California, where I am employed as a realtor.
 - 3. I satisfy all applicable requirements to possess a firearm under state and federal law and currently own a handgun.
 - 4. I am not prohibited from owning firearms under the laws of the United States or the state of California. I have never been found by any law enforcement agency, any court, or any other government agency to be irresponsible, unsafe, or negligent with firearms in any manner.
 - 5. I have two licenses to carry a firearm issued by the states of Arizona and Utah. Between these two licenses, I am authorized to carry a firearm in thirty-five states, not including California.
 - 6. Before moving to Los Angeles, I maintained a license to carry a firearm for four years that was issued by the Kern County Sheriff under California Penal Code section 26150.
 - 7. After moving to Los Angeles County, I applied for a Carry License with the Los Angeles County Sheriff James McDonnell on or about July 30, 2015, using the California Department of Justice's standard application form that the Sheriff's Department provided me. I asserted as my "good cause" for a license the fact that my job duties require me to enter vacant industrial buildings alone to show properties and perform inspections, where I frequently meet individuals for the first time and I encounter vagrant men who are often much larger than me, and would like to protect myself.
 - 8. Sheriff McDonnell denied my application for lack of "good cause." A true and correct copy of the denial letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

- 9. I do not currently qualify for any of the exceptions to California's carry restrictions that would allow me to carry a firearm outside my home for self-defense in some manner.
- 10. I fear that if I am attacked, I will not be able to protect myself, because I cannot lawfully carry a firearm outside my home in any manner.
- 11. I wish to immediately exercise my constitutional right to carry a firearm in public for self-defense, but I am precluded from doing so because I am unable to obtain a license to carry a firearm and California generally prohibits me from carrying a firearm in any manner, openly or concealed, without such a license.
- 12. But for California's comprehensive restrictions on the public carriage of firearms and my inability to obtain a Carry License, I would lawfully carry a firearm in non-sensitive public places for self-defense, but I refrain from doing so for fear of liabilities for violating one or more of California's laws that criminalize my doing so.
- 13. I am thus completely barred from exercising my right to bear arms for self-defense without risking criminal prosecution.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct. Executed within the United States on September 11, 2017.

Dear Ms. Flanagan:

We have received and reviewed your application for a concealed weapon license. The circumstances, as outlined in the application, do not satisfy the requirements for the existence of good cause and we must, pursuant to our policy, deny your request.

Our stated policy as to what constitutes good cause for the issuance of a permit is stated below for your information:

".....specifically state under the section entitled "Qualifications for a CCW License" those circumstances which present convincing evidence of a clear and present danger to life, or of great bodily harm to the applicant, his/her spouse, or dependent child, which cannot be adequately dealt with by existing law enforcement resources and which danger cannot be reasonably avoided by alternative measures, and which danger would be significantly mitigated by applicant's carrying of a concealed firearm."

Typically, the verbiage "convincing evidence of a clear and present danger...." refers to a current situation which involves a specific person(s) who has threatened an individual and who has displayed a pattern of behavior which would suggest that the threat(s) could be carried out. Situations which would suggest only a potential danger to one's safety, (e.g. carrying large amounts of money to the bank, profession/job, working late hours in a high crime rate area, etc.) are not consistent with the criteria for issuance of a concealed weapon license.
