The cross-motions for summary judgment, one filed by Defendant Xavier Becerra, in his official capacity as Attorney General of the State of California ("Defendant"), and the other filed by Plaintiffs Michelle Flanagan, Samuel Golden, Dominic Nardone, Jacob Perkio, and the California Rifle & Pistol Association ("Plaintiffs"), came on for hearing in this Court on November 6, 2017. Defendant had timely lodged evidentiary objections to the declaration of Rick Travis submitted in support of Plaintiffs' motion for summary judgment. Defendant later timely had lodged amended evidentiary objections on the same subject matter, to conform the previously submitted objections to the requirements of the Court's initial standing order for civil cases.
