6	EXAMINATION
7	BY MR. BRADY:
8	Q. Good morning. My name is Sean Brady. I am
9	counsel for the plaintiffs in the matter of Flanagan v
10	Becerra.
11	Can you state your name for the record, please.
12	A. Kim, K-i-m, Raney, R-a-n-e-y.
13	Q. May I call you Chief Raney?
14	A. Chief, Kim is fine. I'm retired.
15	Q. Okay. I'd like to mark as Exhibit 1.
16	(Exhibit 1 was marked.)
17	THE WITNESS: Thank you.
18	BY MR. BRADY:
19	Q. Have you seen this document before?
20	A. I have.
21	Q. I'm sorry. You have?
22	A. I believe I have.
23	Q. And it is a deposition notice with your name on
24	it asking that you appear today at this location at
25	9:00 A.M., although we agreed to 10:30 start time. Is
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1	any personal experience in the state of California with
2	lawful open carry, so wouldn't your conclusion that law
