Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 Order:

Examples of What's Open in Los Angeles County

Through our Safer at Home efforts, we've collectively slowed the spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in Los Angeles County, allowing for a phased reopening of some businesses and public spaces. However, COVID-19 remains a serious risk. Please continue to practice social (physical) distancing and wear a facemask whenever you are or may be around others, and to wash your hands frequently. Also, remember to stay home if you are sick or if you have been in close contact with someone who is sick.

The following are examples of public sites and activities that are open and temporarily closed under the Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 Order. - <u>Cardrooms, Satellite Wagering, and Racetracks</u> with Onsite Wagering

- Golf Courses
- Gyms/Fitness Centers, including in Multi-unit Residential Housing
- Horse Riding/Equestrian

- Hotels for Leisure Travel
- Libraries (For Curbside Pick-up Only)
- Model Airplane Areas
- Museums, Galleries, Zoos, and Aquariums
- Music, Film, and Television Production
- Parks (Playgrounds are closed.)
- Pickleball and Tennis Courts
- Pro-league Arenas without Live Audiences
- <u>Public Pools</u> and <u>Pools in Multi-Unit Residential</u> <u>Housing (e.g., Apartments, Condominiums, and HOAs)</u>
- Public Trails (Walking and Hiking)
- Shooting and Archery Ranges
- Vehicle-Based Parades

- Arcades, Bowling Alleys, and Movie Theaters
- Baseball and Soccer Fields
- Basketball and Volleyball Courts
- Festivals and Theme/Amusement Parks (including Water Parks and Splash Pads in these Parks)
- Hot Tubs, Jacuzzis, and Spa Pools not on Residential Property
- Live Performance Theaters and Concert Venues
- Lounges and Nightclubs
- Stadiums and Arenas (Closed to the Public)
- Youth Sports Leagues

Shopping, Restaurants, and Personal Care CAN BE OPEN FOR IN-STORE SHOPPING AND SERVICES

- Grocery Stores, Certified Farmers' Markets, Farm and Produce Stands, Supermarkets, Food Banks, Convenience Stores, Wholesale Clubs, and Pharmacies
- Hair Salons and Barber Shops
- Lower-Risk Retail Stores, such as Bookstores, Jewelry Stores, Furniture Stores, Toy Stores, and Clothing Stores
- Pet Food Stores, Animal Daycare and Boarding Facilities, and Veterinary Clinics
- <u>Personal Care Services</u>, with Limited Occupancy: Nail Salons, Tanning Salons, Esthetician, Skin Care, and Cosmetology Services; Electrology, Body Art Professionals, Tattoo Parlors, and Piercing Shops; and Massage Therapy (in Non-Healthcare Settings)
- Restaurants and Cafés, including for On-Site Dining
- Stores that Sell Products Needed for Your Home, such as Hardware, Building, Home Appliance, and Pool Supply Stores
