Dear Justice Cohen:

On behalf of the National Rifle Association of America (the “NRA”), I respectfully request that the Court extend the word limit on the NRA’s response to the NYAG’s letter brief on its motion to dismiss the NRA’s counterclaims, dated May 17, 2022. Currently, the word limit, which is set forth in the Court’s order at NYSCEF 658 is 1,250. The NRA requests a word limit of 3,000 words.

The NRA’s submission is due tomorrow, May 24, 2022.

Assistant Attorney General Monica Connell informed the NRA that her office has no objection to the word limit increase as long as her office’s reply submission is subject to a 3,000-word limit as well. The NRA does not object.

The reason the NRA asks for a 3,000-word limit is because, in the OAG’s submission on May 17, 2022, in addition to addressing new factual allegations in the NRA’s amended counterclaims, the OAG also raised a new dismissal argument, which asks the Court to dismiss all of the NRA’s counterclaims on mootness grounds. The NRA therefore wishes to adequately address all of the NYAG’s arguments.
