12 11. **Prohibiting the Carrying of Concealed Deadly Weapons,**
13 **Ordinance no. 84, Charter and Ordinances of the City of Sacramento (1876).**
14 A true and correct copy of this document is attached as **Exhibit K.** Exhibit K is a
15 copy of a historical ordinance from the City of Sacramento that was enacted in
16 1876.

17 A court shall take judicial notice of such a fact if requested by a party and
18 supplied with the necessary information. *See* Fed. R. Evid. 201(d). Judicial notice
19 of Exhibits A through K is proper because the documents for which this request is
20 made are “capable of accurate and ready determination by resort to sources who
21 accuracy cannot reasonably be questioned.” Fed. R. Evid. 201(b)(2). Indeed, “[a]
22 trial court may presume that public records are authentic and trustworthy.”
23 *Gilbrook v. City of Westminster*, 177 F.3d 839, 858 (9th Cir. 1999) (taking judicial
24 notice of agency report).

25 Most of these exhibits are either directly from government websites, or the
26 websites of contractors working with those governments to handle CCW permit
27 application processing. “[A] court can take judicial notice of a government's
28 website.” *EVO Brands, LLC v. Al Khalifa Grp. LLC*, 657 F. Supp. 3d 1312, 1321

1 (C.D. Cal. 2023), citing *Daniels–Hall v. National Education Association*, 629 F.3d
2 992, 999 (9th Cir. 2010) (taking judicial notice of information on the websites of
3 two school districts because they were government entities).

4 As for the two historical ordinances cited from the nineteenth century, those
5 are also subject to judicial notice. See *Baird v. Bonta*, No. 2:19-CV-00617-KJM-
6 AC, 2023 WL 9050959, at *7 (E.D. Cal. Dec. 29, 2023) (taking judicial notice of
7 historical laws and regulations governing public carry of weapons).

8 Judicial notice of these records is therefore appropriate.

EXHIBIT A

License to Carry Firearms

An individual who is 21 years of age or older may apply to a sheriff for a license to carry a firearm concealed on or about one's person or in a vehicle within this Commonwealth. If the applicant is a resident of this Commonwealth, they shall make application with the sheriff of the county in which they reside. (Pa.C.S. § 6109 (b)).

Applying

Applications can be completed online through Permitium (click on link to left) or on paper in person. Applying online will allow us to perform the PICS (Background) check and have your license ready to be picked up to avoid wait times. We would only need to take your picture for the license when coming in to pick up license.

Completed and signed paper applications **must** be returned in person to:

Paper applications may be picked up and completed at the time of application or downloaded and printed ahead of time.

When You Arrive

When you arrive, come into the main doors of the main courthouse, go through security, and get on the elevator. Go to 3rd floor, go to your right off the elevator and the Firearms & Licenses Division of the Sheriffs Office is the first office on the right. Recent upgrades to the License to Carry computer system has made instant issue possible. If the criminal history check is approved, you will receive your license when you apply.

Additional Office Hours/Location

The Sheriff's Office will stay open until 8 p.m. the second Wednesday of each month for the convenience of our License to Carry Firearms Applicants. (Unless noted due to County Holiday)

Fees

The total fee for a License to Carry is \$20.00 and is due at the time of application. Cash, Check and Money Order made payable to the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office and Credit Cards are accepted. A convenience fee will apply when paying by Credit Card.

Firearms Reciprocity Agreements

When carrying your Pennsylvania issued license in reciprocating states, you must be aware of and follow that state's current firearm law(s). For the most current list of reciprocating states and their laws, see the Pennsylvania Attorney General's [website](#).

Firearm Safety

Citizens who choose to bear the responsibility of carrying a concealed weapon are solely responsible for keeping safety in mind at all times. This includes the safety of yourself and society around you.

- Always keep your firearm secured and out of children's reach when not in use.
- Never place your finger on the trigger unless you fully intend to shoot.
- Always be aware of your target and what is beyond it.
- Use only the accessories and ammunition that are specifically made for the model of the firearm you own.

Safety & Law Enforcement Officers

For the safety of our Law Enforcement Officers and the aversion of embarrassing situations, please remember these important tips:

- When dealing with Law Enforcement Officers, always inform the officer immediately that you are carrying a weapon and keep your hands in plain sight.
- If carrying concealed and you are pulled over on a traffic stop, again, immediately inform the officer and keep both hands on the steering wheel and in plain sight.

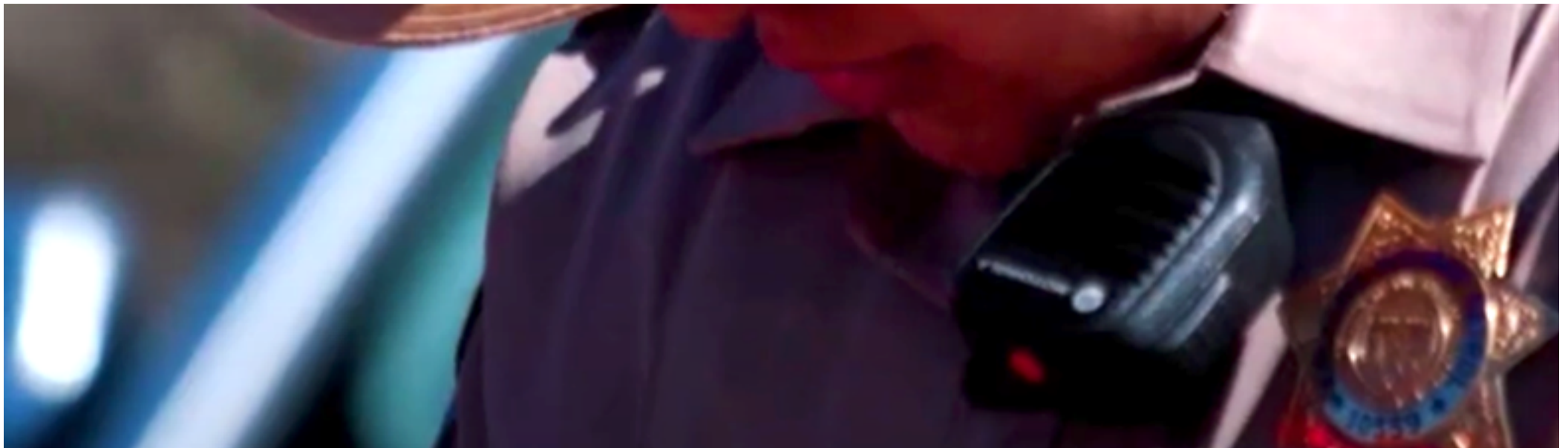

Applications will be accepted through the mail or in person, from 8:00 am until 5:00 pm at the above location.

What Will it Cost to Apply?

The fees to apply for a concealed firearm permit are \$53.25 for Utah residents and \$63.25 for non-residents. Please make checks and money orders payable to the "Utah Bureau of Criminal Identification."

Who is Eligible?

Minimum requirements for application for a concealed firearms permit in Utah are:

- Applicant must be at least 21 years of age for the standard permit; at least 18 years of age for the provisional permit
- Proof of good character...whereas the applicant;
 - has not been convicted of a felony;
 - has not been convicted of any crime of violence;
 - has not been convicted of any offense involving the use of alcohol;
 - has not been convicted of any offenses involving the unlawful use of narcotics or other controlled substances;
 - has not been convicted of any offenses involving moral turpitude;
 - has not been convicted of any offense involving domestic violence;
 - has not been adjudicated by a court of a state or of the United States as mentally incompetent, unless the adjudication has been withdrawn or reversed
 - is qualified to purchase and possess a firearm pursuant to Section 76-10-503 and federal law

*A criminal background check is conducted for all applicants.

What Must Accompany the Application?

- **A Photocopy of your state issued Driver License**
- **Photograph.** One recent color photograph of passport quality.
- **Non-resident proof of permit.** If you reside in a state that recognizes the validity of the Utah CFP or has reciprocity with Utah, you must obtain a CFP or CCW from your home state and submit a copy of it with your application for a Utah permit. For a list of reciprocal states [click here](#). You are considered a resident of whichever state issued your ID. If your state does not recognize the Utah permit this does not apply.
- **Fingerprint Card.** One fingerprint card. Must be filled out completely. Writing and prints must be legible. Fingerprint should be taken by a trained fingerprint technician. Fingerprint cards that are not legible will be returned to the applicant and will cause a delay in processing the application.

- You will need to provide picture identification (i.e. Washington driver’s license or identification card) along with a \$125 check or money order payable to Washington State Treasurer.
- The law enforcement agency's address is dependent upon where your firearms dealer’s business resides. Applications are then sent to DOL. See below for mailing addresses for forms with and without payments.

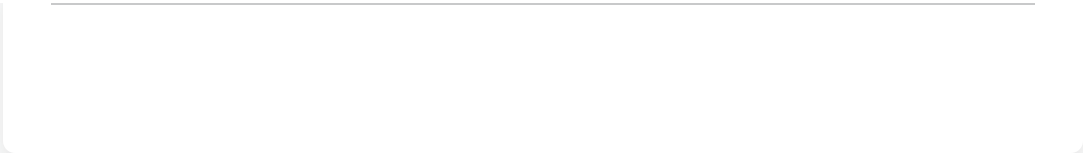

Any licenses issued by another agency must be renewed by that agency or the applicant may submit a new application with the Glendora Police Department for consideration. All outside agency permit holders will be considered new applicants when applying with the Glendora Police Department.

Authority

California Penal Code sections 26150 and 26155 provide that a Sheriff of a county or the Chief or other head of municipal police department of any city, or city and county, shall issue or renew a license to carry a pistol, revolver, or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person (Concealed Carry Weapon license).

Who Shall be Issued a License

The licensing authority specified in Penal Code sections 26150 and 26155 shall issue a license to persons who are not a disqualified person to receive such a license, as determined in accordance with the standards set forth in Penal Code 26202, meet residential requirements, and have completed a course of training. All applicants for a Concealed Carry Weapon license will be fingerprinted and state and federal records will be checked to determine if they are eligible to possess firearms. [Click here](#) to view all categories that would prohibit a person from possessing firearms and being granted a Concealed Carry Weapon license.

Completing the Application

California Penal Code sections 26150 and 26155 provide that a sheriff of a county or the chief or other head of a municipal police department of any city or city and county shall issue a license to carry a pistol, revolver, or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person (CCW license). Penal Code section 26175 requires the Attorney General to prescribe a statewide standard

application form for a CCW license. Answering all the questions on the Application does not guarantee the issuance of a Concealed Weapon Permit. The determination whether to issue the license is at the discretion of the licensing authority. Pursuant to California Penal Code section 26160, each licensing authority will have a written policy summarizing their requirements for issuance of a Concealed Weapon Permit. In addition, prior to issuing a Concealed Weapon Permit, the California State Statutes require proof that:

- The applicant is not a disqualified person to receive such a license, as determined in accordance with the standards set forth in Penal Code 26202;
- The applicant is at least 21 years of age, and presents clear evidence of the person's identity and age, as defined in Penal Code 16400;
- The applicant is a resident of that city or city and county. Prima facie evidence of residency within the county or a city within the county includes, but is not limited to, the address where the applicant is registered to vote, the applicant's filing of a homeowner's property tax exemption, and other acts, occurrences, or events that indicate presence in the county or a city within the county is more than temporary or transient. The presumption of residency in the county or city within the county may be rebutted by satisfactory evidence that the applicant's primary residence is in another county or city within the county;
- The course of training prescribed by the licensing authority has been completed.
- The applicant is the recorded owner, with the Department of Justice, of the pistol, revolver, or other firearm for which the license will be issued.

Character References

You will need to provide the names and contact information of three persons willing to serve as references. One of the three must be a person described in Penal Code section 273.5, subdivision (b) (your spouse, or former spouse, your cohabitant or former cohabitant, your fiancée, or someone with whom you have, or previously had, an engagement or dating relationship, or the mother or father of your child), if applicable. At least one of the three must be your cohabitant if applicable.

Prior to Filling Out This Application

- Be prepared to scan a copy of your valid California Driver's license or California Identification card, which reflects your current City of Glendora address.
- Be prepared to scan copies of two proof of residency documents - current and consecutive utility bills/statements that are in your name and reflect your current address in the City of Glendora. If utility bills/statements are in your spouse's name, we will accept them with proof of marriage or legal domestic partnership. If you do not have utility bills in your name, residency documentation provided must be a monthly recurring bill. Mortgage statements and annual bills are NOT accepted as the primary proof of residency document. Past due bills/statements are NOT accepted. For the

secondary proof of residency document, any current documents listed on the California DMV “Residency – Documents List” will be accepted. Click [here](#) for the list.

- Be sure that each firearm you plan on listing on your Concealed Carry Weapon license is on record in the state of California in your name.

Training Required

If applying for a **NEW** Concealed Carry Weapon license a course approved by the Glendora Police Department must be completed prior to permit issuance. This course will be a minimum of **16 hours**. This training is not required to be completed until the applicant's fingerprint based criminal background check from the California DOJ is received by the licensing authority. Once the licensing has received verification from California DOJ that the applicant is not prohibited from carrying a firearm, then the class may be taken.

If applying for a **RENEWAL** Concealed Carry Weapon license, a **8-hour** course approved by the Glendora Police Department must be completed prior to permit issuance.

If applying for a **MODIFICATION** to your current Concealed Carry Weapon license that includes a firearm change, address change, or name change, you will need to submit updated proof of verification for each change, including training certifications from a training vendor approved by the Glendora Police Department as well as complete and sign DOJ Form BOF 4502. Please refer to the City of Glendora Fee Schedule for the current fee for an amended license.

- The Glendora Police Department recognizes only select training facilities to satisfy your qualification certification. Training from any other facility will not be accepted. Approved training facilities are listed [HERE](#). The Glendora Police Department accepts only those training providers listed as approved by Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. 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EXHIBIT I

Psychological Assessment

The La Verne Police Department has closely evaluated the need for the psychological assessment requirement during the CCW application process. Through discussions with our City Attorney and our police department psychologist, as well as review of empirical based studies and review of other peer department CCW programs, the Chief of Police has made the decision to require a psychological assessment for all La Verne PD CCW licenses.

Using a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) format, the department has developed some reasoning and information behind the need for a psychological assessment:

What psychological assessment tool does La Verne PD use?

The test we use in our psychological evaluations is the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory (MMPI), which was developed in the 1920s and has been updated regularly over the years. It is an evidence-based measure and is considered one of the most well-researched, valid, and reliable psychological tests in the country. It is used by mental health professionals to assess and diagnose mental illnesses such as depression, anxiety, and anti-social or psychopathic behaviors. It is also what law enforcement officers are given when entering this profession. It is one of the most researched psychological tests in existence and there are more than 10,000 peer-reviewed published research papers on the MMPI.

What psychological assessment vendor does La Verne PD use?

We have a contract with The Counseling Team (TCT). They are a trusted vendor for the police department and are used by many other police departments in Los Angeles County. In addition to using the MMPI, TCT also asks questions during their evaluation to assess for "behaviors of concern", including mental health issues, drug/alcohol abuse, impulsivity, sleep problems, anger management, employment history, and interpersonal difficulties. Their detailed assessment is very important for the police chief as it assists with making an informed decision when issuing a CCW permit.

Isn't the psychological assessment more of a personality test?

Our assessment looks at both the pathology of mental illness, depression and anxiety for example, as well as how someone interacts with the world around them. Labeling the MMPI as a personality test is simplifying a very detailed and proven scientific tool. There is no perfect test and there is no way to predict all behavior. However, the process La Verne PD uses gives a better overall picture of the applicant and assists the police chief with making an informed decision regarding our CCW applicants.

What legal authority does the La Verne Police Chief have to require a psychological evaluation?

California Penal Code 26190(f) essentially states: If psychological assessment is required by the licensing authority (Police Chief), the applicant shall be referred to a licensed psychologist that is the same used for testing of its own employees. The applicant can be charged for the cost of psychological testing not to exceed \$150.

Does La Verne PD have a policy on the CCW program?

Yes - it is posted on our website.

What feedback do we get from our City of La Verne residents?

Many of our La Verne residents/applicants state that they are pleased we require a psychological assessment. They are supporters of the 2nd amendment but want a thorough process that includes a psychological assessment.

Can a La Verne resident get a CCW elsewhere?

La Verne PD respects the opinion of some individuals who believe that psychological assessments should not be required for a CCW. The law is specific (CA PC 26155 (a)(3)), where residents are directed to apply for a CCW with the municipality where they reside. La Verne residents who have strong opinions of the psychological assessment are directed to consider applying with the County of Los Angeles.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

ORDINANCE No. 1141.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE CARRYING OF CONCEALED WEAPONS.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Oakland as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person in the City of Oakland, not being a public officer or a traveler actually engaged in making a journey, to wear or carry concealed about his person without a permit, as hereinafter provided, any pistol, slung-shot, brass or iron knuckles, sand club, dirk or bowie knife, or iron bar or other dangerous or deadly weapon, or any sling or other contrivance by which shot or other missiles are or may be hurled or projected. A written permit may be granted by the Mayor for a period of not to exceed one year to any peaceable person whose profession or occupation may require him to be out at late hours of the night to carry a concealed deadly weapon upon his person.

Section 2. Every person violating any provision of this ordinance is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed one hundred dollars; and in case such fine be not paid, then by imprisonment at the rate of one day for every two dollars of the fine so imposed.

Section 3. An ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Prohibit the Carrying of Concealed Weapons in the City of Oakland," approved November 10, 1875, and also Section 1 of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Carrying of Pistols and Sling-shots," approved May 4, 1881, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

SEC. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the city prison not exceeding ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. *Amendment, by Ordinance 95, passed July 17, 1876.*

ORDINANCE NO. 83.

Establishing the grade of certain streets, passed April 24, 1876.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Sacramento ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The grades of Second, Third, Fourth, Sixth, and Eighth streets, between I and J streets, shall be as determined by right lines drawn from the established grade of J street to points to the several adjacent alleys, six inches below the grade of J street, thence to the established grade of I street.

SEC. 2. The grades of Second, Third, Sixth, and Eighth streets, between J and K streets, shall be as determined by right lines drawn from the present established grade of K street to points at the several adjacent alleys, six inches below K street, thence to the established grade of J street.

SEC. 3. So much of section four, chapter five, of the City Ordinance as conflict with this ordinance is hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 84.

Prohibiting the carrying of concealed deadly weapons, passed April 24, 1876.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Sacramento ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, not being a public officer or traveler, or not having a permit from the Police Commissioners of the City of Sacramento, to wear or carry, concealed, any pistol, dirk, or other dangerous or deadly weapon.

SEC. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the city prison not exceeding ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. *Amendment, by Ordinance 95, passed July 17, 1876.*

SEC. 3. The Police Commissioners of the City of Sacramento may grant written permission to any peaceable person, whose profession or occupation may require him to be out at late hours of the night, to carry concealed deadly weapons for his protection.

SEC. 4. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage.
