ROB BONTA, in his official capacity as 13 Attorney General of California, 14 Defendant. 15 I, Marco Antonio Carralero, declare: 16 1. I am over 18 years old. I am competent to give this declaration. I have 17 personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this declaration and would be able to 18 testify to them if called as a witness. 19 2. I am a citizen of the United States, and a resident and citizen of the State of 20 California, currently residing in Orange County, California. 21

- 4. I have possessed a Georgia Weapons Carry License, issued by the Fulton County Probate Court, since 02/24/2021, and I recently obtained a New Standard California Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) 2 Year License, issued by the Orange County Sheriff-Coroner Department, for my personal firearm.
- 5. Carrying a personal firearm for self-defense and for defense of my wife is important to me.
- 6. I participated in the Orange County Sheriff's Department Citizen's Academy in 2022 to learn more about local law enforcement in my county. I am a member of the Orange County Gun Owners PAC, the California Gun Rights Foundation, and Firearms Policy Coalition, Inc.
- 7. I completed the application process for a Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) license from the Orange County Sheriff-Coroner Department, including a course of instruction at an approved training provider deemed acceptable by the Orange County Sheriff's Department CCW Unit on 8/25/23, as required by the State of California to obtain my CCW license.
- 8. I carry, and intend to continue carrying, my personal firearm daily, during all my activities.
- 9. Professionally, I run operations for my family business. Daily responsibilities include managing our company office and warehouse, where we store

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valuable inventory, equipment, and technology. As a small local business, we cannot afford to hire private security. Since receiving my CCW, I carry my personal firearm for self-defense there every day.

- 10. I either already carry, or plan to carry in the coming weeks, my personal firearm for self-defense to the private businesses I frequent for work including hardware stores, Home Depot, Lowe's, private carriers including UPS and FedEx, and retailers including Target, Walmart, Albertsons-Safeway, Gelson's, CVS, and Ralph's. If SB2's provision about private businesses were to go into effect, I would restrict my carrying practices at private businesses for fear of arrest or prosecution.
- 11. I plan to carry my personal firearm for self-defense to a medical office or other place where medical services are currently provided in the coming weeks and months, both for my own routine medical care and to accompany my wife.
- 12. I would like to carry my personal firearm for self-defense to establishments licensed to serve alcohol for on-site consumption in the coming days, including Oak Ranch Grill, Morena's Mexican Cuisine, and other local eateries I frequent. However, when I filled out my CCW license application, I was informed that even with a license, I could not carry in bars or any location whose primary purpose is to dispense alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption. I am unaware of the legal authority for this restriction, but I comply with it anyway for fear of prosecution. If I were permitted to visit restaurants and bars while carrying my personal firearm, I would not consume alcohol while carrying.

- 13. I plan to carry my personal firearm for self-defense to stadiums near where I live in the next few months, including Championship Soccer Stadium and Angel Stadium of Anaheim. If required by these locations, I would lock my firearm in the provided lockers. But if SB2 goes into effect, I could not even bring my personal firearm into the stadium/arena or its parking lot.
- 14. With my carry permit, I would regularly carry my personal firearm at museums, especially at Bowers Museum in Santa Ana, where I go with my family, and the Surfing Heritage and Culture Center. I also frequent the Dana Point Historical Society where I am a Board Member, and I would carry there in the near future.
- 15. I plan to carry my personal firearm for self-defense to parks near where I live. I frequent the following parks weekly for hiking and walking with family or alone: Crystal Cove State Park, Aliso and Wood Canyons Wilderness Park, Salt Creek Beach Park, San Clemente State Beach, Las Ramblas Trailhead, Ronald W. Caspers Wilderness Park, and Thomas F. Riley Wilderness Park.
- 16. I have every intention and desire to continue to carry for self-defense at the warehouse where I work, at the private businesses I frequent, at bars, restaurants, stadiums, parks, medical offices, and local nature trails. I would continue to carry at these locations in the future, but I will decline to do so because of my credible fear of arrest and prosecution after January 1, 2024, the effective date of SB 2.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

provision about private businesses were to go into effect, I would restrict my carrying practices at private businesses for fear of arrest or prosecution.

- 9. With my carry permit, I would regularly carry my personal firearm at and in restaurants, bars, and other establishments that are licensed to sell liquor for on-site consumption. These locations include restaurants, sports bars, and breweries. However, when I filled out my CCW license application, I was informed that even with a license, I could not carry in bars or any location whose primary purpose is to dispense alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption. I am unaware of the legal authority for this restriction, but I comply with it anyway for fear of prosecution. If I were permitted to visit restaurants and bars while carrying my personal firearm, I would not consume alcohol while carrying.
- 10. I regularly attend public gatherings for which a permit is required while carrying my personal firearm, including the weekly Sunset Market in Oceanside, local farmer's markets, and political rallies and events.
- 11. I regularly visit parks near where I live, including Guajome Park and Mission Trails. I have also visited parks under the control of the California Department of Parks and Recreation and Department of Fish and Wildlife, including Hollenbeck Nature Preserve. I plan to continue visiting these and other parks that are subject to SB 2's carry ban, and I plan to carry my personal firearm for self-defense when visiting these parks.

- 12. I frequently return to the San Francisco Bay Area, where I was born and raised. When I am visiting I often use public transportation (such as BART) when traveling around the region. I would carry my personal firearm while using public transportation in the Bay Area.
- 13. I have visited amusement parks with family in the past 12 months, and plan to go again when babysitting for relatives. I would carry at the parking lot or within the amusement park, if permitted, particularly to protect my wife and members of my family who have small children.
- 14. I have every intention and desire to carry in the locations identified above, and would continue to do so in the future, but I will decline to do so because of my credible fear of arrest and prosecution after January 1, 2024, when SB 2 takes effect.

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#### I, Michael Schwartz, declare:

- I am over 18 years old. I am competent to give this declaration. I have personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this declaration and would be able to testify to them if called as a witness.
- 2. I am a citizen of the United States, and a resident and citizen of the State of California, currently residing in San Diego County, California.
- 3. I am the Founder of the San Diego Gun Owners PAC and the Orange County Gun Owners PAC. I am also a member of the Firearms Policy Coalition and the California Gun Rights Foundation.
- 4. San Diego County Gun Owners PAC (SDCGO) is a political organization based in San Diego County, whose purpose is to protect and advance the Second Amendment rights of residents of San Diego County, through their efforts to support and elect local and state representatives who support the Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms, education, and advocacy on Second Amendment issues. SDCGO's membership and donors consist of Second Amendment supporters, people who own guns for self-defense and sport, firearms dealers, shooting ranges, and elected officials who want to restore and protect the right to keep and bear arms in California.
- 5. SDCGO has one or more members who live in California and who travel throughout California in the ordinary course of their lives, and who also possess a CCW issued by the appropriate licensing authorities. SDCGO has at least one member who has a CCW license and regularly carries firearms in and at each of the locations challenged in this Complaint. These members of SDCGO with CCW licenses intend to continue to possess and carry firearms at such locations, but reasonably fear prosecution if they do so after January 1, 2024. SDCGO brings this action on behalf of its members who have an active CCW, which includes myself and Plaintiff Ham.
- Orange County Gun Owners PAC is a political organization based in 6. Orange County, whose purpose is to protect and advance the Second Amendment

rights of residents of Orange County, through their efforts to support and elect local and state representatives who support the Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms, education, and advocacy on Second Amendment issues. OCGO's membership and donors consist of Second Amendment supporters, people who own guns for self-defense and sport, firearms dealers, shooting ranges, and elected officials who want to restore and protect the right to keep and bear arms in California. Myself and Plaintiff Carralero are members of OCGO.

- 7. OCGO has one or more members who live in California and who travel throughout California in the ordinary course of their lives, and who also possess a CCW issued by the appropriate licensing authorities. OCGO has at least one member who has a CCW license and regularly carries firearms in and at each of the locations challenged in this Complaint. These members of OCGO with CCW licenses intend to continue to possess and carry firearms at such locations, but reasonably fear prosecution if they do so after January 1, 2024. OCGO brings this action on behalf of its members who have an active CCW, which includes each of the individual plaintiffs.
- 8. I am not prohibited under state or federal law from acquiring or possessing firearms or ammunition.
- 9. I have a California Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) license, issued by the San Diego County Sheriff, for my personal firearm.
- 10. I completed the application process for a CCW license from the San Diego Sheriff, including a course of instruction at an approved training provider deemed acceptable, as required by the State of California to obtain my CCW license.
  - 11. Carrying a personal firearm for self-defense daily is important to me.
- 12. I carry, and intend to continue carrying, my personal firearm daily, during all my activities. I consider my firearm as much a part of my daily routine as my phone, keys, and wallet.

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- I am on the road a lot for work, traveling to meet with donors and 13. members of my organizations.
- 14. I carry my personal firearm for self-defense to the restaurants I visit for work meetings two to three times per week, which include everything from taco shops and Carl's Jr. to Ruth's Chris Steak House. I would also like to carry in locations serving alcohol for on-site consumption, such as bars. However, when I filled out my CCW license application, I was informed that even with a license, I could not carry in any location whose primary purpose is to dispense alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption. I am unaware of the legal authority for this restriction, but I comply with it anyway for fear of prosecution. If I were permitted to visit bars while carrying my personal firearm, I would not consume alcohol while carrying.
- 15. I carry my personal firearm for self-defense to the private businesses I frequent for work and personal business, including grocery stores, coffee shops, local and national retail stores, office buildings, medical offices, hardware stores, convenience stores, and more. If SB2's provision about private businesses were to go into effect, I would restrict my carrying practices at private businesses for fear of arrest or prosecution.
- I plan to carry my personal firearm for self-defense to a medical office or 16. other place where medical services are currently provided in the coming weeks and months.
- I would like to carry my personal firearm for self-defense to amusement 17. parks, including their parking lots, near where I live, such as Disney California Adventure Park, Knott's Berry Farm, and SeaWorld.
- I typically carry my personal firearm for self-defense to stadiums, such 18. as Petco Park and Pechanga Arena. If required by these locations, I lock my firearm in the provided lockers. But if SB2 goes into effect, I could not even bring my personal firearm into the stadium/arena or its parking lot.

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- 19. When traveling to stadiums or arenas, I take public transportation and typically carry my personal firearm for self-defense on public transportation.
- With my carry permit, I regularly carry my personal firearm at museums, especially those in Balboa Park (including the San Diego Air & Space Museum and Natural History Museum). In addition, I have carried my personal firearm when visiting the Creation and Earth History Museum in Santee.
- I frequently carry my personal firearm for self-defense to parks, including La Mesa Park, Mast Park in Santee, Presidio Park, Robb Field, and Dog Beach, unless prohibited by county restrictions. If those restrictions did not exist, I would carry in all these parks.
- I frequently carry my personal firearm for self-defense at public 22. assemblies, including street fairs I attend for business to set up booths, and other social assemblies like farmers markets and guacamole festivals.
- I frequently carry my personal firearm for self-defense at zoos, including 23. the San Diego Zoo and San Diego Safari Park.
- I frequently carry my personal firearm for self-defense at public libraries, 24. which I use as workspaces when I am on the road for work.
- 25. I frequently carry my personal firearm for self-defense at gambling establishments, including Viejas Casino and Resort, Sycuan Casino, Rincon Casino, and the Lucky Lady Casino Card room on El Cajon Boulevard. If required by these locations, I lock my firearm in the provided lockers. But if SB2 goes into effect, I could not even bring my personal firearm into certain of these gambling establishments or its parking lot.
- 26. I have every intention and desire to continue to carry for self-defense all the locations just mentioned, but I will decline to do so because of my credible fear of arrest and prosecution after January 1, 2024, the effective date of SB 2.

- 1. I am the chairman of the California Gun Rights Foundation ("CGF"), a non-profit foundation incorporated under the laws of California with a place of business in Sacramento, California. In my role as chairman, I am familiar with CGF's purposes as an organization, CGF's membership, and CGF's organizational responses to California's Senate Bill 2, signed into law on September 26, 2023.
- 2. CGF serves its members, supporters, and the public through educational, cultural, and judicial efforts to defend and advance Second Amendment and related rights. CGF has tens of thousands of members and supporters in California, including in all cities and counties that are parties to this action. CGF brings this action on behalf of its members, including Plaintiffs Carralero, Ham, and Schwartz.
- 3. CGF's members and supporters have been adversely and directly harmed by Defendants' threat of enforcement of the law challenged in this case.
- 4. On September 26, 2023, California Governor Gavin Newsom signed SB2 into law, which bars licensed concealed carry in many public locations, including restaurants, bars, public transportation, stadiums, libraries, museums, zoos, amusement parks, medical facilities, gambling establishments, and more. SB2 also imposes a no-carry default on private businesses open to the public, barring carry there unless the business owner expressly provides otherwise.
- 5. CGF's members will be adversely and directly harmed by Defendants' enforcement of law once SB2 takes effect on January 1, 2024. CGF has at least one member who has a CCW license and who carries firearms in and at each of the locations challenged in this Complaint, at which locations CCW licensees will be prohibited from carrying their arms by SB2 as of January 1, 2024. These CGF members would fully intend to continue to carry at the locations challenged in this Complaint after January 1, 2024, but for their reasonable fear of prosecution if they do so after January 1, 2024.

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I, Brandon Combs, declare:

- I am over 18 years old. I am competent to give this declaration. I am providing this declaration based on my personal knowledge and experience.
- I am the president of Firearms Policy Coalition, Inc. ("FPC"), a non-2. profit membership organization incorporated under the laws of Delaware with a primary place of business in Clark County, Nevada. In my role as president, I am familiar with FPC's purposes as an organization and FPC's membership.
- The purposes of FPC are to create a world of maximal human liberty and 3. freedom and to promote and protect individual liberty, private property, and economic freedoms. It seeks to protect, defend, and advance the People's rights, especially but not limited to the inalienable, fundamental, and individual right to keep and bear arms and protect the means by which individuals may exercise the right to carry and use firearms.
- 4. FPC serves its members and the public through legislative advocacy, grassroots advocacy, litigation and legal efforts, research, education, outreach, and other programs.
- 5. FPC's has members that reside both within and outside the State of California, including in Orange County, California, and San Diego County, California. Each of the named individual Plaintiffs in this case are members of FPC.
- 6. FPC represents the interests of its members and brings this action on behalf of its members.
- FPC's members and supporters have been adversely and directly harmed 7. by Defendant's threat of enforcement of SB2.
- 8. On September 26, 2023, California Governor Gavin Newsom signed SB2 into law, which prohibits carry in many public locations, including restaurants, bars, public transportation, stadiums, libraries, museums, zoos, amusement parks, medical facilities, gambling establishments, and more. SB2 also imposes a no-carry default on

private businesses open to the public, prohibiting carry there unless the business owner expressly provides otherwise.

9. FPC's members will be adversely and directly harmed by Defendant's enforcement of the law challenged herein once SB2 takes effect on January 1, 2024. Indeed, FPC has members who have a California carry license and have, currently do, and would continue to carry in the locations challenged in this lawsuit—including the individual named Plaintiffs—on and after January 1, 2024, but for the enforcement of and reasonable fear prosecution under SB2.
